

## Minibiking Comes to Peterborough

Sunday, 30<sup>th</sup> May sees the second round of this year's Minibike Masters series coming to Buttercup Farm, Peterborough.

The MinibikeMasters is a non-profit making race series, brought to you by riders for riders. Hopefully this form of sport will appeal to youngsters and get bikes off streets and onto purpose built facilities thereby reducing the incidences of anti social behaviour normally associated with mini bikes. Now into our second year of running we have made slight changes to the format from 2009 to bring you , what we hope to be an even better series in 2010.

Over 100 riders aged from 6 to 60 years old, turned up at our first round at Scunthorpe and enjoyed a well organised days racing with local riders doing well on the day. A lot of riders have switched classes this year , which made for some interesting racing . Trevor Scott , now riding superstock stamped his authority in his new class with 2 out of 3 wins . Local boy Kev Wells taking a well deserved victory and pushing Trevor all the way .

In the Pro 50s it was a treat to watch Nick Cole as he destroyed the field , but he was unlucky and had engine trouble in the second race letting Jonny Groves take the overall on the day .

The over 35s made for some great action with Bradley Briggs sweeping to a hat trick of wins , but the real race was behind him , with Dave Paddon and Craig Lucas battling all the way to the wire.

The Open-mini was proving to be a one horse race with Pat Crump storming ahead in motos 1 and 2 but again the engine gremlins got to him and a dnf in the last race cost him the overall , It was a consistent Luke Coker that took the overall from Crump by just one point . Ethan Breckon took a clean sweep of motos in the youth 6-8 with Miles Beaumont following him home in second .

The midsize pro was anyones race as the leaders swapped positions lap after lap with Pat Crump again taking control at the front , with Bradley Briggs , Luke Humphries and Rob Clitheroe all fighting for second . Luke Humphries claimed the overall though with Briggs in second .

With the line up all most full the Mid size clubman was the biggest group of the day with nearly 30 riders ready to do battle , and battle they did !

Mark Richardson taking a convincing overall ahead of Oliver Pearce .

Onto the youth 9-12 and it Jason Breckon who walked away with the overall in his class with 2 out of the 3 wins , Kieran Sembiente stealing a well deserved last race victory .

The last group of the day was the youth 9-12 and there was no holding back as Jake Mickleburgh took his 1<sup>st</sup> overall of his career with Ben Rial closely following him home in second .

Lastly I would like to personally thank the land owner Mr Pete Sembiente for allowing the minibikemasters to be the first club to use there new purpose built facility . Nice one Pete !
